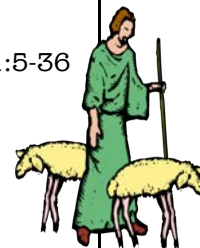

<p style="text-align: center;"><u>First Day</u></p> <p>Jesus enters Jerusalem, He weeps for the city. At evening time, he returns to Bethany after having entered the temple and looking at all things. (Zeph1:12)</p>	Sun	21:1-11 21:17	11:1-11	19:29-44	12:12-19

<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Third Day</u></p> <p>On His way to Jerusalem, Jesus teaches "that believing prayer can move mountains". Jesus teaches in the temple: Challenged by the Sanhedrin. Parables of the two sons and the vineyard. Parable of the Marriage Feast. The Pharisees and Herodians try to trap Jesus with His own words. Caesar's image on the coin. He battles the Sadducees' objections about the resurrection. Jesus answers the question, "Which one is the great commandment?" There is no answer to Jesus' question, "If Christ be the Son of David, how shall David call Him Lord?" Warning against scribes and Pharisees. The widow's offering to God's Treasury. Some Greeks seek to see Jesus. This is a pledge to His coming glory and gathering-in of the Gentiles. Jesus' prayer and the Father's answer heard by the disciples. Destruction of the temple and Jewish theocracy is revealed. The Last Days. <u><i>The Seventh Day</i></u> Pilate grants a guard and the grave is sealed. <i>Christ's Resurrection, His Appearance during Forty Days and Ascension.</i>	Sat	27:62-66			
<u><i>First Day-Easter Sunday</i></u> Resurrection at first dawn. The women find the sepulcher open and empty. Mary Magdalene returns to tell Peter and John. The remaining women see two angels who declare the Lord's resurrection. Mary Magdalene returns to the sepulcher. Jesus reveals Himself to her. <i>First Appearance.</i> Jesus meets the women on their return to the city.-Second Appearance. Peter and John find the sepulcher empty. Report of the guards to the chief priests who bribe them to lie. Jesus seen by Peter.-Third Appearance Seen by the two disciples on their way to Emmaus-Fourth Appearance Jesus appears to the Ten, Thomas being absent-Fifth Appearance. <u><i>Subsequent Appearances</i></u> Jesus appears when Thomas is present. Sixth Appearance. The Eleven go to the mountain in Galilee. Jesus appears and commands them to teach all nations.-Seventh Appearance Jesus shows Himself at the sea of Tiberius- Seen by five hundred brethren at once probably along with the Eleven.-Ninth Appearance. He is seen by James, then all the Apostles. Tenth Appearance. The Ascension, forty days after Easter. Purpose and Conclusion.
